Kreysler (Kreysler & Associates, on Green Island Road), Mr. Daub will be here Wednesday evening, April 2, starting at 6:30.


Then the 22nd Art Extravaganza will be held on Friday & Saturday, April 4-5, 2014. We received over 130 pieces of art from almost 50 artists in the North Bay area. Our judges narrowed it down to 63 great works of art. The show is free and open to the public—and we need you to check it out and vote for the “People’s Choice.” That’s also how we will pick door prize

winners, too!

We also have three “pop up” art locations, in which local artist member have their work on display during some or all of April. The three artists and their locations are:

- Chris Tennyson at American Canyon City Hall;
- Jonette McNaughton at Umpqua Bank in the Canyon Plaza Center; and
- Augusta Asberry at the Fairfield Inn by Marriott.

All of this is our contribution to the annual Napa Valley Arts in April program, sponsored by Visit Napa Valley and Arts Council Napa Valley. During the first week of April, we along with Napa City and wineries in the Carneros & South County area, have art-related events.

GRANTS UPDATE

The Foundation is finishing up its 2013 Capacity Building grant from the County. This \$5000 grant is to develop a business plan and new website. It is also turning out to include some preliminary designs to upgrade the look and functionality of the Gallery and exteriors of the Art Center.

We also received a \$500 grant from the City to promote our expanded art classes. We are recruiting new teachers and will use the money to

GALLERY UPDATES

A lot has been going on with the Canyon Gallery and Art Center in the last month.

First, we are renting the back room and are almost finished converting it into a dedicated classroom and Ceramic Center. This is a critical first step to expand our class offerings.

Second, this will let us better organize and ultimately remodel the Gallery Area. Part of our County Grant to develop a Business Plan includes developing ideas and funding sources to remodel the Gallery. We'll have more as time goes on.

Third, we are also looking at ways to

improve the entrance of the Center, including landscaping and signage, as well as potential façade improvements, and maybe some more paint!

On a more financial note, we are also beginning to use our accounting software to



streamline operations—for example, we will start sending an invoice for your monthly Gallery Space Rental, and you can pay online if you want. We are also looking at buying a cash register that can expedite sales as well as track sales transactions, which also means less time double-entering records.

Later this year we will sit down with our volunteers and begin creating job descriptions (or maybe *Volunteer* Descriptions!) for everyone, to better define what is expected of our volunteers and how we can make their service more beneficial to them as well as to the Foundation.

New Church—We also have a new church that is renting space on Sundays. They are growing their organization, and their rent helps cover the cost of the new classroom space. Pastor Ashford McClean welcomes any new members.

"Kid's Birthday Events" by Jan—Our own Jan Harris has started a new business, using the Art Center as a base. It's a arts and crafts based birthday party that helps to develop their creative side. The price includes a full service birthday party celebration with all of the trimmings, as well as a contribution to the Foundation for each event!

advertise for students, young and old alike.

Finally, we have applied for a \$10,000 grant from the County to develop a marketing program, including two new brochures—one promoting the Arts Foundation, and one promoting the Canyon Gallery & Art Center—as well as "save the date" postcards. It will also include a Marketing and Promotions Guidelines, to help us better plan and promote our special events.

We won't know the outcome until later this Spring, but we're hopeful.
